MINUTES OF MEETING
JULY 11, 2022

The regular meeting for the City of Sykeston was held on July 11, 2022. Present was Mayor Rick Richter, council members Jerome Hoheisel, Dennis Johnson, Auditor Deanna Haugen, Donna and Bob Stringer, Richard Hatch, Daniel and Sonja Johnston, Karen Neumiller, Christa Hatch, Tom Klabunde and Chris McIntosh. June meeting minutes were read and approved first by Dennis Johnson and second by Jerome Hoheisel. July bills were presented: Central Plains \$1,220.26; Ottetail City, 447.05; Ottetail 1/2 power, 68.85; DCT 1/2 phone, 43.20; ND Dept. of Health, 14.00; Double M Sanitation, 2,143.79; Independent, 187.67; Deanna Haugen, 507.92; Jon Oatis 334.32, Park Tax 71.54, Jana Hopkins 500.00, Pat Biel Trucking 232.26. Bills were approved first by Jerome Hoheisel and second by Dennis Johnson. Dennis Johnson has agreed to be a council member, Vice President is Jerome Hoheisel. Liquor license was approved for Daniel and Sonja Johnston, amount of license was \$238.15, approved first by Jerome Hoheisel and second by Rick Richter. Two sets of meeting minutes to hang up. Tabled until later discussion. Tom Klabunde called in with a water tower update Caldwell was staying all week to finish the punch list. Punch list was emailed to council members and mayor with all updates included. The old water tower coming down July 13, 2022. Chris McIntosh asked about any permits needed to build on his apartments on vacant lot. Council will look into it. Council looking into graveling roads. Subject tabled until later date. Dennis Johnson talked with Leon Klocke about the city getting more money and snow removal. Council is looking into generators for the sewer lift, water tower, and water plant. Rick Richter hired Daniel Johnston to take a look at the buildings to see what kind of generators the city would need in case of power outages. Tabled until more information is available. Rick will call Bismarck to see if they can raise the dike. Also, the lagoon needs to be cleaned out. Tabled until more information is available. Dennis Johnson wanted this statement added: Per Tom Klabunde, the City of Sykeston is not responsible for the issue with the water tower. Caldwell Tank is responsible.

Bullet points:

- Kim Speldrich presented false information as fact to the council. She stated that Sykeston Legion would not be allowed to open without a Fire Sprinkler System installed. That is false and has been proven as such in the Fire Marshal's inspection report. The specifics of this were also documented in my statement.
- Kim Speldrich used vulgar language towards me, including ethnic slurs. The specifics of what she said were also listed in my

statement of incident. Given her vulgarity, I understand not putting exact words in the meeting minutes, so I am okay with listing vulgar language and ethnic slurs.

• My statement of incident also included a review and response time period for anyone at the meeting to read my statement of incident and respond in writing if my statement requires more information or if their recollection was different than mine.

The due date given for this was 28th of June, 2022, coinciding with the Special Board Meeting for the election results. I attended that meeting and as of that time and to date, no responding statements have been received and I need that documented as well. DUCKS AND MERGANSERS: SPECIES/SEX RESTRICTIONS
The daily bag limit of 6 ducks including mergansers may include no more than 5 mallards of which only 2 may be female mallards, 1 scaup, 3 wood ducks, 1 pintail, 2 redheads, 2 canvasbacks. *In addition to the daily bag limit of ducks listed above, an additional 2 blue-winged teal may be taken from Sept. 24 - Oct. 09. The possession limit for duck including mergansers shall be three times the daily bag limit.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR

- Reporting harvest of bobcats, mountain lions, fishers and river otters can now be done online by visiting My Account at the North Dakota Game and Fish Department website, gf.nd.gov.
- Pre-charged pneumatic air guns are now legal for taking weasel, mink, muskrat, and mountain lion.
- The prairie chicken and sage grouse seasons remain closed due to low populations.
- Opening day for ducks, geese, coots and mergansers for residents is Sept. 24. Nonresidents may begin hunting waterfowl on Oct. 1.
- Nonresidents are not allowed to hunt on Department wildlife management areas or on PLOTS areas from Oct. 8-14. Exception: nonresidents hunting on PLOTS land that they own.

ATTENTION HUNTERS

2022 FALL WILD TURKEY HUNTING PROCLAMATION SUMMARY

The North Dakota Game & Fish Department announces the following summary of regulations and changes for the 2022 Fall Wild Turkey hunting season.

- Licenses will be issued by a weighted lottery procedure through the Department's Bismarck office. Applicants must apply online through the Department's website at gf.nd.gov. Only residents may apply. The deadline for submitting online applications is September 7, 2022.
- The season will run from October 8, 2022 through January 1, 2023.
- The bag limit will be one wild turkey of any sex or age per license.
- Turkeys may be legally taken with shotguns, muzzleloading long guns, certain handguns, and bow and arrow.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR

- Total licenses available increased to 3,975 (up from 3,825). Additional licenses, up to a maximum of 1,300, may be issued for specific hunting units.
- Unit 21 will remain closed to fall turkey hunting in 2022.
