Representatives from the Community Club and Kim Speldrich were present to discuss the sale of the 'Cafe' building. The City would sell it back to the Community Club and then they would sell it to the current occupants. The League of City has been contacted about some of the legalities. If the selling price is less than \$2500 then the sale of the property would not have to be sold thru bids. More information is needed about the property lines, who owns which lots, and/or who is going to appraise the property. Tabled till more details are known.

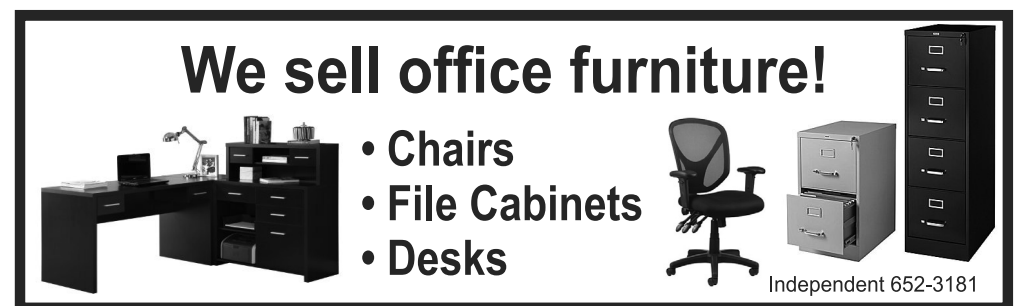
