MINUTES OF MEETING CARRINGTON SCHOOL DISTRICT # 49 SCHOOL BOARD MEETING

A regular meeting of the Carrington School District #49 School Board was held on September 12. 2023, at 4:00 P.M. in the high school ITV room. Present: Tonia Erickson, Kevin Wolsky, Angela Kutz, Dr. Ben Garr, and Joel Lemer. Absent: none. Kimarv Edland recorded the minutes.

President Lemer called the meeting to order at 4:02 P.M. and declared a quorum present. Added to the Agenda by consensus were Item C-4, Facilities meeting and Action Item 17, Mrs. Helm accompanying FFA students to the National Convention.

It was moved by Kutz, seconded by Erickson and carried (all voting yes on a voice vote) to approve the minutes from August 15, 2023.
