Also present was Auditor/Treasurer Ellen Roundy, Road Superintendent Nate Monson, States Attorney Kara Brinster, and Foster County Independent reporter Leasa Lura.

The meeting began with approval of the minutes for the September 19th, 2023, regular meeting, and September 28th, 2023, Special Meeting. Commissioner Hagel motioned to approve all minutes, seconded by Commissioner Utke. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Commissioner Beumer motioned to approve the bills seconded by Commissioner Copenhagen. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Auditor/Treasurer Roundy stated that the BOCC will need to appoint one delegate for the NDSF annual meeting. In the past Donna Anderson has served that role but will not be able to this year. Commissioner Utke motioned to allow Roundy and Extension Agent Jeff Gale the authority to select a delegate on the BOCC's behalf and get the letter drafted and sent, seconded by Commissioner Copenhagen. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Roundy presented the minimum sale price for three properties on the tax foreclosure list. Commissioner Beumer motioned to approve the minimum sale price, seconded by Commissioner Hagel. All voted aye and the motion passed. Roundy stated that they can place tax statements on the website with Vanguard at no additional charge. The Auditor/Treasurer and Tax Director offices field many requests, and this would help with the workload.

Commissioner Beumer motioned to approve placing tax statements online, seconded by Commissioner Hagel. All voted aye and the motion passed.

Auditor/Treasurer Roundy provided the BOCC with a Floodplain permit application. Karen Kempert, Emergency Manager from Cavalier County has provided Roundy with guidance since Foster County is currently without an Emergency Manager. The National Flood Insurance Program Coordinator from the state recommended that the Foster County Chairman sign with the EM vacancy. Commissioner Beumer motioned to approve the Chairman's signature on the floodplain permit application for the bridge removal project, seconded by Commissioner Utke. All voted aye and the motion passed. Discussion was had on the tablets with no decision made. No updates for the building project or the ambulance building. Commissioner Hagel attended the CCEDC meeting and stated that many projects are in the works with funds being awarded. Commissioner Hagel stated that they are still looking for an individual in Foster County to sit on the Central Prairie Human Service Zone Board.

## Farm to School meetings

BISMARCK – The North Dakota Department of Agriculture (NDDA) is holding Farm to School meetings across the state over the next two months as part of an effort to improve access to local foods in schools by developing a stronger and more sustainable Farm to School program in the state.

“The enhanced Farm to School program will increase the amount of lo-
