Erdmann presiding.

The Pledge of Allegiance to
the flag was recited.

were present: Troy Roundy, Neil
Fandrich, Chase Pederson, Ty-
ler Hoggarth, Trygg Olson, Doug
Smith, Abby Geroux, Jason Wol-
sky, Christopher Bittmann, and
Pam Jerome.

Absent: Auditor Gast

Also present: Leasa Lura, Kel-
ly Hagel, Becky Hagel, and Justin
Johnson.

A motion was made by Olson,
seconded by Hoggarth, to ap-
prove minutes of the regular coun-
cil meeting held October 9, 2023.
All voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Smith,
seconded by Fandrich, to approve
consent agenda items:

a. To ratify the following game
of chance permits issued by the
City Auditor: #1014 to Foster
County Fair Board for a calendar
raffle and #1015 to Friends of
Carol Sherman Benefit for a raffle.
b. To approve CCEDC's re-
quest for an Annual Light Parade

Union Insurance.

c. To approve the Frater-

tion to include twenty-one.

All voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Olson,
to approve the first reading of Or-
dinance #279 to repeal and re-en-
act Chapter 9, Sections 0102-
0128 of the City of Carrington
Municipal Code, relating to dan-
gerous buildings and building of-
ficials duties.

A motion was made by Smith,
to approve the first reading of Or-
dinance #280 to repeal and re-en-
act Chapter 34, of the City of Car-
rington Municipal Code, relating to
the maintenance of junk.

Kelly Hagel addressed council
regarding his property.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FIRE DEPT:

Assistant Chief Wolsky re-
ported 5 calls since the last report,
both checks from the Insurance
Premium came in and due to the
efforts of the Chiefs Association
and Insurance Commissioner Of-
fice the total between the 2 had in-
creased since last year, and they
had helped with the Carol Sher-
man benefit.

FINANCE & LEGAL:

Mayor Erdmann reported they
had reviewed bids for city hall fur-
niture, transferring Municipal court
to District court, Auditor Gast has
filed liens for outstanding bills,
Sales tax will be over \$500,000.00
this year, Health contract & premi-
ums, donation from Waste Man-
agement of \$1,500.00, and Audi-
tor Gast was asked by ND League
of Cities to be one of six individu-
als to review the required Audi-
tor's certification program that has
to be completed within one year of
hire for new Auditor's for updates,
accuracy, and suggestions for im-
provement.

A motion was made by Roundy,
seconded by Fandrich to ap-
prove Rough Rider Industries
updating City Hall desks and cre-
denzas, up to \$28,000.00, with
cost coming out of account 217.

The following voted in favor:
Pederson, Smith, Fandrich, Roundy,
Olson, and Hoggarth.

Against: None. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Roundy,
seconded by Fandrich, to ap-

prove Auditor Gast interview & ne-
gotiate a cleaner for City Hall and
the Police department. All voted
aye. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ped-
erson, seconded by Hoggarth, to ap-
prove a 15% immediate increase
in pay for the Police Department,
with starting pay for a new officer
increased to \$58,477.33. The fol-
lowing voted in favor: Hoggarth,
Olson, Roundy, Fandrich, Smith,
and Pederson. Against: None.

A motion was made by Hog-
garth, seconded by Fandrich, to
approve specific to the Police
Department: When under staffed,
officers may be on call time. Any
officer on call for 12 hours or more
will be granted up to 6 hours of
call back pay. In the event the of-
ficer is called out more than the
6 hours, the actual call back pay
will apply. The following voted in
favor: Pederson, Fandrich, Smith,
Roundy, Hoggarth, and Olson.
Against: None. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Smith,
seconded by Olson, to approve
Mayor Erdmann continuing ne-
gotiations with Foster County
to transfer Municipal to District
Court. All voted aye. Motion car-
ried.

A motion was made by Roundy,
seconded by Pederson, to ap-
prove Auditor Gast sign 2024
BCBS health plan renewal. The
following voted in favor: Smith,
Fandrich, Pederson, Hoggarth,
Olson, and Roundy. Against:
None. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Roundy,
seconded by Olson, to ap-
prove \$1,500.00 annual donation
from Waste Management to be
awarded to Carrington Commu-
nity Endowment Fund. All voted
aye. Motion carried.

CCEDC:

A motion was made by Smith,
seconded by Fandrich, to ap-
prove CCEDC's recommendation
to approve Hayden House's ap-
plication for the scholarship pro-
gram with the city's commitment
of \$4,250.00 paid in 4 payments
over two years. The following
voted in favor: Hoggarth, Olson,
Roundy, Fandrich, Smith, and
Pederson. Against: None. Motion
carried.

A motion was made by Ped-
erson, seconded by Hoggarth, to
allow the marketing of the Indus-
trial Park at \$5,000.00 per acre.
All voted aye. Motion carried.

Councilman Pederson re-
ported they had met tonight and

Headlock's LLC permit to extend
liquor license to wrestling build-
ing, Holiday with Hero's on Dec
6, 2023, and discussed traffic and
parking citations.

garth, seconded by Fandrich to
approve Headlock's LLC liquor
extension to the wrestling build-
ing on December 9, 2023 from
4:00pm to 10:00pm with security
and sidewalk roped off. All voted
aye. Motion carried.

side water expansion tie in was
pressure tested, SIRM 20/20
lease agreement, water produc-
tion report, 2 water breaks, snow

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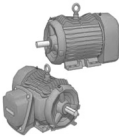

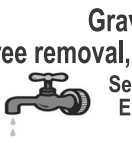
