school ITV room. Present: To-

Lemer. Absent: none. Kimary Ed-
land recorded the minutes.

President Lemer called the
meeting to order at 4:03 P.M. and
declared a quorum present.

It was moved by Garr, sec-
onded by Erickson and carried (all
voting yes on a voice vote) to ap-
prove the minutes from November
14, 2023, and December 6, 2023.

Financial reports for the Activ-
ity Fund, Special Reserve, Build-
ing, Special Assessment, Capital
Projects, General, and Hot Lunch
Funds were reviewed. It was
moved by Wolsky, seconded by
Kutz and carried (all voting yes on
a voice vote) to accept the reports
as presented.

It was moved by Wolsky, sec-
onded by Erickson and carried (all
voting yes on a voice vote) to ap-
prove the check registers and pay-
ment of bills.

Mrs. Helseth presented up-
dates on elementary school hap-
penings including Christmas
concert and activities; Cardinal
Way Award for music rehears-
als; school assembly presentation
from Darrin Crow on Storytelling;
reported that teacher evaluations
are almost complete; that the staff
is participating in a most festively
dressed contest and secret San-
tas; and she presented 4th grade
trendline results.

Mr. Weber reported on the
hour of coding; band and choir
concert; winter activities; State
Student Council; semester tests;
completion of fall coaches' eval-
uations; MTSS Team evaluations;
and the Vision Zero School launch.

Mrs. Helm reported that she
attended the State One Act Play
contest, the parade, concerts,
and judged the FFA employment
skills event; that Daktronics fixed
the speaker for our sound system;
presented a new timeline for re-
ceiving our buses that have been
purchased; that the professional
development day on Improving
Academic Literacy was a huge
success; and that Joel and she has
contacted area schools to discuss
Career and Technology Education
and will begin meeting with them
this week.

The City of Sykeston has re-
ceived a Community Develop-
ment Block Grant (CDBG) from
the State of North Dakota Division
of Community Services (DSC).
CDBG funds are intended to pro-
vide decent housing, suitable living
environments, and economic op-
portunities, principally for low/very
low-income persons through re-
habilitation and preservation, eco-
nomic/job development and public
facilities improvement.

The project and funding level
considered was \$71,520.07 for the
Sykeston Water Tower Rehabilita-
tion Project.

It is estimated that approxi-
mately 51.48% of the funds bene-
fited low/very low-income persons.

Displacement of neighborhood
persons or businesses did not oc-
cur, and no housing units were de-
molished or converted as a result of
the above-mentioned projects.

2024, in the Sykeston Fire Hall and
City Hall, 34 Main Ave N, Sykeston,
ND 58486 to obtain citizen views
and to respond to proposals and
