MINUTES OF MEETING CARRINGTON SCHOOL DISTRICT # 49 SCHOOL BOARD MEETING FEBRUARY 13, 2024

A regular meeting of the Carrington School District #49 School Board was held on February 13, 2024, at 4:00 P.M. in the high school ITV room. Present: Tonia Erickson, Dr. Ben Garr, Kevin Wolsky, and Joel Lemer. Angela Kutz attended via phone. Absent: none. Bobbi Jarrett recorded the minutes.

President Lemer called the meeting to order at 4:05 P.M. and declared a quorum present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

It was moved by Wolsky, seconded by Erickson and carried (all voting yes on a voice vote) to approve the minutes from January 11, 2024, and January 23, 2024.

Financial reports for the Activity Fund, Special Reserve, Building, Special Assessment, Capital Projects, General, and Hot Lunch Funds were reviewed. It was moved by Garr, seconded by Erickson and carried (all voting yes on a voice vote) to accept the reports as presented.

Mrs. Helseth presented updates on elementary school happenings including NWEA testing, Cardinal Way Award to 5th grade for lunchroom, student engagement survey, kindergarten "On the Move to Food Adventures" lessons presented by Donna Anderson, Students of the Quarter, 100th day of school activities, Spelling Bee, 6th grade Slick Tracy presentation from Robin Simonson on alcohol prevention, and compassion retreat for 5th & 6th grade. She also reported that the elementary has been having grade level planning meetings; that the Wilton teachers and principal visited the school; that she attended MTSS training and the ND Principal Conference; and that two teachers are attending the SEEC Beginning Teacher's Network.

Mrs. Helm reported that she attended the superintendents conference and the NDSBA conference on negotiations, policy, employee investigations and Title IX; that the policy process has started; that Pingree Buchanan School Board and superintendent toured the facilities; and that she hired Joanna Lee as custodian and Courtney Wiesz as prom advisor.

Mr. Weber presented updates from the high school including Mathcounts, SnowBall, archery tournament, COGNIA, Rollie Johnson compassion retreat for the 7th & 8th grade; and reported on the principal conference and AI training.

Mr. Lemer directed the Board to complete the superintendent evaluation by March 7, 2024. Calendar Committee: Kevin presented the three calendar proposals that the committee reviewed at their January 18, 2024, meeting. It was moved by Kutz, seconded by Erickson and carried (all voting yes on a voice vote) to approve Option 2 with a start date of August 20, 2024, and graduation on May 25, 2025.

Transportation Committee: Kevin and Tonia reviewed the minutes from the January 18, 2024, meeting where the committee discussed bus routes. It was moved by Erickson, seconded by Wolsky and carried (all voting yes on a voice vote) to rescind the 3-mile

SUMMARY OF CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR

- A bighorn sheep hunting season is scheduled to open in 2024, unless there is a recurrence of bacterial pneumonia. Applicants may apply for a license at this time, but not in a specific unit. The status of the bighorn sheep season will be determined by September 1.
• Total elk licenses increased by 230 to 833.
• Total moose licenses decreased by 15 to 242.
• All moose licensees and Unit E1E, E1W, E2, and E6 elk licensees may hunt during both the Bow Season and the Regular Season until license is filled. Moose Hunting Units M1C and M4 will remain closed in 2024.
