

Week is October 8-14. This year local volunteers are teaming up with the National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®) to promote this year's FPW campaign, 'Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention<sup>™</sup>." The campaign works to educate evervone about simple but important actions they can take when cooking to keep themselves and those around them safe.

According to NFPA, cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries in the United States. Unattended cooking is the leading cause of cooking fires and deaths.

"Year after year, cooking remains the leading cause of home fires by far, accounting for half (49 percent) of all U.S. home fires," said Lor-

National Fire Prevention raine Carli, vice president of outreach and advocacy at NFPA. "These numbers tell us that there is still much work to do when it comes to better educating the public about ways to stay safe when cooking.

Your local volunteer firefighters offers these key safety tips to help reduce the risk of a cooking fire.

1. Watch what you heat. Always keep a close eye on what you are cooking. Set a timer to remind you that you are cooking.

2. Turn pot handles toward the back of the stove. Always keep a lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan and turn off the burner.

3. Have a "kid- and petfree zone" of at least 3 feet around the stove or grill and anywhere else hot food or drink is prepared or carried.
